DAB / DRB EXPERIENCE

I have acted as both the chairperson and as a member of a large number of DABs / DRBs, both in Botswana and in the Republic of South Africa. My appointments include, amongst others, roads projects, bridge projects in Botswana, a pump station, a pipeline, various engineering and construction projects and sundry other infrastructural projects (including those pertaining to the Medupi and Kusile Power Stations) in the Republic of South Africa. I am currently seized with a number of matters in regard whereto I act as the sole adjudicator or as one of three adjudicators. I estimate that I have acted in at least 100 dispute boards since the introduction of such boards in the Republic of South Africa.

I have also acted as a facilitator in regard to a DAB/DRB workshop and have lectured, *inter alia*, attendees at courses run by the Arbitration Foundation of Southern Africa and the Association of Arbitrators (Southern Africa) and by various firms of Attorneys.

ARBITRATION EXPERIENCE

I have acted as an arbitrator in relation to many disputes over at least the last 20 years. The disputes which have been arbitrated by me, with very few exceptions, have comprised construction/ engineering disputes. I am currently seized with a number of matters in regard whereto I act as the sole arbitrator. I have published awards in respect of disputes involving both parastatals and listed companies. I estimate that I have presided over in excess of 100 arbitrations during the last 20 years.

EXPERIENCE GENERALLY

I have now practiced as a lawyer for almost 40 years. My practice has changed over time to the point where, although I still very rarely act for parties, whether Employers or Contractors, the vast majority of my practice is made up of appointments to act as a *iudex*, that is, either as an Adjudicator or Arbitrator. I am as such conversant with the provisions of the FIDIC "family" of contracts, the NEC 3 contracts, the JBCC contract, the SAICE (South African Institute of Civil Engineers) contract and the contracts promulgated by various professional organisations operating in the Republic of South Africa, Namibia, Botswana and Swaziland (now referred to as eSwatini). I have also appeared on behalf of both Contractors and Employers in the High Courts of the aforesaid countries and also in the Royal Courts of Justice in London (on commission *de bene esse*).
